Festival chair etiquette - You may leave your chair at a stage, but if you leave your chair at a stage you can expect it to be sat in by anyone who wants to. If you sit in someone's chair. please quickly get up when the owner returns.

Trash & Recycling - This year we will be recycling aluminum cans only, all other trash should be put in barrels or dumpsters located throughout the park. We have asked our food vendors to serve with biodegradable plates, cup and utensils to reduce the volume going to the landfill. Keeping it clean leads to everyone feeling good!

This jam does not seem friendly? Sometimes folks travel long and far to pick with each other. If the jam is tightly formed, listen, appreciate and let these friends get it together.

If twenty folks are picking, can you really contribute? Maybe enjoy or come back later.

#### **Leftover Salmon**

Few bands stick around for 30 years. Even fewer bands leave a legacy that marks them as a truly special, once-in-lifetime type band. And no band has done all that and had as much fun as Leftover Salmon. Since their earliest days as a forward thinking, progressive bluegrass band who had the guts to add drums to the mix and who were unafraid to stir in any number of highly combustible styles into their ever-evolving sound, to their role as pioneers of the modern jamband scene, to their current status as influential elder-statesmen of that scene — casting a huge shadow over every festival they play — Leftover Salmon has been a crucial link in keeping the traditional music of the past alive, simultaneously pushing that sound forward with their own weirdly unique style. Their story is one of tragedy and rebirth, of unimaginable highs and crushing lows, of friendships, of music, but most importantly it is the story of a special band and those that have lived through it all to create, inspire, and have everlasting fun. In 2021, the band returned to Compass Records for their release Brand New Good Old Days. The band now features a line-up that has been together longer than any other in Salmon history and is one of the strongest the legendary group has ever assembled. Built around the core of founding members Drew Emmitt and Vince Herman, the band is now powered by banjo wiz Andy Thorn and driven by the steady rhythm section of bassist Greq Garrison and drummer Alwyn Robinson.



#### **Becky Buller Band**

Becky Buller is a 10-time International Bluegrass Music Association (IBMA) award winner who made bluegrass music history in 2016 by becoming the first artist ever to win in both instrumental and vocal categories, as well

as the first female to win Fiddle Player Of The Year. Her songs, recorded by some of the industry's best, preceded the fiery-haired fiddler's own prominence as an artist in the acoustic music world. She has written songs for Grammy award-winning albums: Becky co-wrote "Freedom", the lead-off track of The Infamous Stringduster's 2018 Grammy award-winning album, Laws Of Gravity, as well as "The Shaker", featured on The Travelin' McCoury's self-titled release that just brought home the 2019 Best Bluegrass Album Grammy, Artists including Ricky Skaggs ("Music To My Ears"), Rhonda Vincent ("Fishers of Men"), Doyle Lawson & Quicksilver ("Be Living"), Josh Williams ("You Love Me Today"), Russell Moore & Illrd Tyme Out ("My Angeline", "Rest My Weary Feet", "Cottontown") and Special Consensus ("She Took The Tennessee River", "Scratch Gravel Road") have cut Becky's songs. Becky moonlights with the all-female bluegrass super-group, The First Ladies Of Bluegrass, which includes all the first women to win in their respective categories at the IBMA awards: Alison Brown (banjo, 1991); Becky (fiddle, 2016); Sierra Hull (mandolin, 2016); Missy Raines (bass, 1998); Molly Tuttle (quitar, 2017). This configuration took home the 2018 IBMA "Recorded Event of The Year" award for their work on "Swept Away", written by Laurie Lewis and recorded by the First Ladies on Missy Raines' new solo album, Royal Traveller. The First Ladies were part of a historic all-female Saturday night headline set curated and hosted by Brandi Carlile at the 2019 Newport Folk Festival.

#### Love you like there was no end of love



**The Dillards** Rodney Dillard has had a long and varied career resulting so far in two Grammy Nominations, induction into the International Bluegrass Music Hall of Fame, a well-known acting stint on the Andy Griffith Show, many other movie, commercials and TV appearances, and he is a recipient of The Outstanding Missourian Award, along with worldwide acclaim for his over 50 years of recording both traditional Bluegrass and his own brand of 'DILLARDGRASS'. Rodney Dillard as founding member of the legendary group, 'THE DILLARDS' (aka the Darlings)

is seen nearly every day somewhere in the world thanks to the still enormous popularity of The ANDY GRIFFITH SHOW reruns. Rodney continued to modernize and innovate the sound of Bluegrass as he wrote and collaborated to write such now classic songs as "There Is a Time", "The Darlin Boys", "Ebo Walker", and "Dooley". By the late 1960s Rodney had transformed the Dillards into the driving force creating new sounds in the West Coast music environment. Later, called "The Father of Country Rock", Rodney was among the first Bluegrass musicians to "electrify" traditional Bluegrass instruments while also adding drums, steel guitar, and orchestra. The band's unique flare for song writing and arrangement affected a broad range of important future musicians in the Bluegrass and Pop music world alike. Rodney is credited with helping set the stage for the "Country Rock" movement and burgeoning progressive sounds of Bluegrass.



The Hammer and the Hatchet John Bowyer and Jayme Hood are born and raised Hoosiers who make their home in South Central Indiana on the Brown/Monroe county line. Together, as The Hammer and The Hatchet, they have been on tour in support of "Shake Off The Cold", their fourth album of original Midwestern Roots Music. John and Jayme have been refining their songwriting and musical partnership for 8 years and will

be performing together for the third time at JHMF 2022. Their authentic brand of acoustic music blends mandolin and guitar with strong vocal harmonies into a sound that is reaching beyond their Bluegrass and Americana roots.

#### No end of love



Horseshoes and Hand Grenades While strongly rooted in bluegrass, old-time, and folk music, Horseshoes and Hand Grenades produces a sound that draws on the vaults of music collectively

and individually enjoyed throughout the course of their lives. Their music doesn't lend itself well to categories or boundaries. The boys generally prefer fishing a river or enjoying the company of friends and barley beers. After three albums, innumerable sold-out shows, and countless beers, bluegrass mavericks Horseshoes & Hand Grenades appropriately consider themselves a "family" on a wild, wonderful, and often whacky roller coaster. The bond between the quintet—David C. Lynch [harmonica, accordion, spoons, vocals], Collin Mettelka [fiddle, mandolin, vocals], Russell Pedersen [banjo, fiddle, vocals], Adam Greuel [guitar, dobro, vocals], and Samual Odin [bass]—fuels their creativity and chemistry on stage and in the studio. "Sometimes, it feels like we're modern-day cowboys on some kind of strange journey," Adam affirms with a laugh. "We're five friends who set out to do something we enjoy doing, meet interesting people, see old friends, and make some new buddies along the way. Because of that, everything happens organically."



The High Hawks No one knows where this train will take them. It's one you jump on out of the curiosity and excitement of the unknown. The very wonder of what the stars and the spirits will conjure on any given jubilee. And what the hell is a High

Hawk? Vince Herman (Leftover Salmon), Tim Carbone (Railroad Earth), Adam Greuel (Horseshoes & Hand Grenades), Chad Staehly (Hard Working Americans), Brian Adams (DeadPhish Orchestra), and Will Trask (Great American Taxi) come together as friends to play songs, perhaps bringing an unusual sparkle to the galactic core.

#### With you I'd like to do the things, that I have done before



Great American Taxi No strangers to JHMF, Great American Taxi is a rock & roll classic, a timeless mixture of gutsy pop, calloused-hand country with R&B, and bare-knuckle barroom chooglin' songs for anyone grinding out the working week and anxious to shuffle the day's cares away. The inheritors of the good

times-bad times mojo of Creedence Clearwater Revival, The Eagles, and Lowell George-era Little Feat, G.A.T. are boogie rock champs with big beating hearts backed up by thousands of gigs and highway miles — real music for real people living each day as best they can, dreaming about Friday nights and scoring a few breaks in this wicked world. The band has refined and expanded their vision of what Gram Parsons called Cosmic American Music, a deeply felt, gently groovy kind of Americana that one can down a pitcher of suds to while contemplating life, the universe, and all things. Veterans of the national club scene and festival circuit, the band has settled into switched-on maturity in style, ready to connect with fans old and new, and give them a reason or three to smile and lift their heels. G.A.T. teams up to help each other musically climb from deep, dark valleys to high mountain peaks.



Never Come Down "If you never take a chance, you can never get it wrong...so you better take a chance before it's gone". These lyrics from the song "Chances" on their self-titled debut album have become a mantra for the members of Never Come Down. As Joe Suskind puts

it, "I suddenly had all these opportunities- hosting a weekly bluegrass showcase, meeting a publisher who liked my music and finding musicians who were writing, playing, and aligning their lives with their craft like me. We all felt the pull to take a chance on our music and each other. We're taking a real swing at it." Earnest songwriting, dedication to craft, and genuine care for the music is at the forefront of what they do. "We never tell each other what to play. You can feel when the music is right". It's that feeling- that space Never Come Down creates- that has captivated audiences from the onset.

#### But have a different meaning now



Chicago Farmer and The Field Notes Imagine Pete Seeger, Woody Guthrie, Arlo Guthrie, John Prine, Todd Snider all-in-one, only with a fresh original twist on the mood of today's USA, throw in a full band and you've got Chicago

Farmer and The Field Notes! For the last several years, Cody Diekhoff, who is Chicago Farmer, has been packing all sorts of venues from small intimate listening rooms, to sold out halls, to major festivals all over the country. Chicago Farmer has that gift of clarity and expression, hitting the emotions and consciences of back-roads and small-town America, unveiling the fears and concerns of the inner city and the hopes of all of the above. No matter your individual taste in music, Chicago Farmer connects! Chicago Farmer and The Field Notes are Cody Diekoff (The Original Chicago Farmer), Jaik Willis, Charlie Harris and Cody Jensen, full circle and complete! "I love Chicago Farmer's singing and playing and songs, but it's the intention behind the whole of his work that moves me to consider him the genuine heir to Arlo Guthrie or Ramblin' Jack Elliott. He knows the shell game that goes on under folk music, which is sacred to me. Chicago Farmer is my brother; if you like me, you'll love him."-Todd Snider



Red Mountain Boys The Red Mountain Boys are a hot new bluegrass supergroup lighting up the Pikes Peak region. A longtime staple of the scene, Alan Begley (Willie Bean Bluegrass) fronts the Boys with his Martin flat-top guitar. Lewis Mock (Kansas State Hall-of-Fame musician, Radford & Lewis

Band) brings the fire with his five-string banjo. Jon Murphy (Grandpa's Cough Medicine, The Grass is Dead) keeps the Boys rock solid with his metronome-like bass playing. Jeff Daugherty (2014 John Hartford Songwriting Award winner) plays his mandolin like a man possessed. Take their instrumental prowess, add in four-part vocal harmonies and world-class songwriting and LOOK OUT! It's a recipe for powerful, hard-driving bluegrass music.

#### That wasn't there before



Henhouse Prowlers Founded over 14 years ago with the simple desire to play original and powerful bluegrass, this quartet now finds themselves at the intersection of performance. diplomacy and education. The Prowlers have now been to more than 25 countries across the globe. Working with the U.S. State Department and under their own nonprofit, Bluegrass Ambassa-

dors, the band incorporates music from Africa, Asia, the Middle East and more into their already robust repertoire of unique traditional American music. When performing live, presenting workshops and wherever they are, the Henhouse Prowlers find and spread the commonality we share as human beings through the universal language of music. You can feel it at every show. On stage, the group's electrifying performances give audiences a sense of how much they love what they do: while on record. the band manages to explore their collective life experiences through songwriting and intricate instrumentation. While bluegrass is the undeniable foundation of the Prowlers music, the band manages to bend and squeeze the traditional form into a sound all their own.

Julian Davis and The Situation Julian Davis is a traveling musician, plying his trade through guitar and mandolin all across this country. Julian enjoys playing the classics that have stood the test of time, and ensuring they last a little longer by giving them one more spin on the dance floor. In 2017 he started traveling solo, singing to concert

halls, theaters, select bars, music festivals, and pretty much anywhere a road can go. In 2018 Julian and his band toured many festivals and venues. In July of 2018 Julian was Artist at Large for Pickin' On Picknic where he had the chance to sit in with the Jeff Austin Band. Magic happened that night and starting in 2019 Julian Davis was the lead guitar player with the Jeff Austin Band through June of 2019. With the untimely passing of Jeff Austin, Julian's band got focused on getting into the studio and working on their upcoming studio LP full of original tunes. To satisfy the requests of fans, the band recorded their live LP: Live from The Ozarks. They will be touring in support of that album as they continue work on the studio LP. The tour schedule ending 2019 and starting 2020 became quite full with a variety of venues and events across 20 states on the tour schedule.



The Sweet Lillies The Sweet Lillies' high-energy, melodic tunes have captured the hearts of fans everywhere. The band credits its appeal to the original and compelling songwriting of three people who share an unwavering commitment to life on the road. The magnetic

combination of Julie Gussaroff on the upright bass, Becca Bisque on the viola, and Dustin Rohleder on guitar gives the band a rare and alluring sound. The Sweet Lillies have shared the stage with the likes of Peter Rowan, George Porter Jr., Steve Kimock, Vince Herman of Leftover Salmon, Kyle Hollingsworth and Jason Hann of The String Cheese Incident, Andy Hall of The Infamous String Dusters, Jeff Austin, and Bridget Law (founding member of Elephant Revival). Based out of Colorado's Front Range, The Sweet Lillies are continually expanding their audience and reach with a contagious love of music and a get-up-and-dance attitude that spreads lots of love and smiles.



David Davis & The Warrior River Boys
David Davis and the Warrior River Boys
have long been recognized as modern
leaders in traditional bluegrass, but on
their latest release "Didn't He Ramble:
Songs of Charlie Poole", they throw genre
boundaries aside by delving deeper into
the roots of acoustic music. They have
produced a masterful and exciting

collection of songs originally recorded in the 1920's by the legendary Charlie Poole and His North Carolina Ramblers, a generation before Bill Monroe is credited with founding bluegrass music. "Our intention was to evolve the songs, yet leave the strength and essence of the original feel as our foundation and build on that," explains Davis. David Davis joined Garry Thurmond and the Warrior River Boys in 1982 at the age of twenty one and by late 1984 accepted the role of bandleader. Since then, he and the band have appeared in forty- six states, all Canadian Provinces and the Bahamas. In 2010, Davis was inducted into the Alabama Bluegrass Music Hall of Fame. In 2014, he was inducted into The National Old-Time Country Music Hall of Fame and was the recipient of the National Old-time Country Music Association's Lifetime Achievement Award in Music in 2016.



Mama Said String Band Mama Said String Band is an instant classic, since 2016 they've been bringing their own brand of the grassroots music you're so used to hearing to stages everywhere. Based out of Louisville, KY, Mama Said String Band brings a refreshing reinvention to Bluegrass, Folk and Americana while focusing on vocal harmonies and contemporary

instrumentation. Having won several notable regional awards including album of the year in the Lexington Music Awards for "Carry The Water", Best Bluegrass Band in the Appalachian Arts and Entertainment Awards, Bluegrass Artist of the Year in the Lexington Music Awards and with three nominations under their belt, they have made a notable imprint in the Kentucky Music Scene. They bring big, relatable emotions and honest songwriting to every show, leaving fans always wanting more.

Wolfpen Branch Beginning in December 2019, Arthur Hancock (guitar) and Chris Shouse (mandolin) formally began writing and rehearsing under the duo "Hancock & Shouse". Longtime friends and collaborators, Hancock and Shouse fell into a groove that quickly ignited the spark. Through

Recognized as a band to watch in 2021 by the Lexington Herald Leader, the group landed on Wolfpen Branch, a name that pays homage to a creek on the Roberts' family property in Estill County where famed Kickin it on the Creek occurs.



Lily B Moonflower Band Lily B Moonflower is a songwriter with a velvet voice and a performer that finds joy in sharing her lifelong craft, carrying on traditions of roots music, and connecting with the souls of the world thru song. She refers to her style of music as Folk 'n Roll

with a Twang. Lily's hand-scripted lyrics are uniquely crafted and are delivered with grace, grit and rockabilly energy. Lily connects with her audience on a profound level and leaves a lasting impression on the folks she meets. Her original songs are like colorful sonic tapestries that uplift any spirit. Her style of writing reflects her genuine soul-shine and her unique perspective. Check out Lily's first single, Midnight Song, off her debut album, Moonflower, released to all streaming platforms this year. This track is a progressive Americana anthem, beautifully crafted to reflect the essence of midwestern life. Combining honest lyrics with soaring vocals, and intricate instrumental interplay-- this fresh single puts a unique spin on a classic sound.

Chain Station has been living life through music and adventures together for eight years. Relentless gigging in and around their home state of Colorado, the midwest and Canada has made this band of brothers one of the tightest, most professional ragtag pack of muppets on the scene today.



Miles Over Mountains Hailing from McHenry, IL, Miles Over Mountains plays a modernized style of bluegrass or "newgrass/jamgrass" that covers a wide spectrum of dynamics and feelings. Their live catalogue draws from their first two records "Five Star Heart Breaker" (2015), "Ballads & Burners" (2017).

and their upcoming third full length album "Work Harder Not Smarter" (2020). In addition, their cover selections are testaments to where bluegrass/roots influence can take music from outside the genre, with lovingly selected takes on their hero's songs served up in their own furious fashion. The band has been performing, touring, and making records since early 2014, playing an average of 120 shows per year.

contributor to the "newgrass" genre through their inventive, free-flowing flatpicking styles and arrangements, all the while paying omnipresent homage to the pioneers of the conventional bluegrass style. While the traditional instrumentation of their songs resounds with familiarity, the techniques they employ—rhythmic changes, melodic sequences, breakdowns, improvised jamming—yield an ever-evolving sonic landscape, rippled with nods to more orthodox offerings from within the realm.



Stillhouse Junkies Born in a distillery in Durango, CO, Stillhouse Junkies play a delirious, head-spinning mixture of original roots, blues, funk, swing and bluegrass music. With all three band members sharing vocal duties and swapping instruments, the Junkies conjure a wide range of tonal landscapes that pay tribute to the iconic

sounds of Gillian Welch, the Allman Brothers, Tim O'Brien, the Wood Brothers, John Hiatt, and countless others while breaking new musical ground with their genre-bending original material.



New Old Cavalry New Old Cavalry is a four-piece string band based in Bloomington, Indiana that deploys nontraditional bluegrass music in a traditional format, expanding the culture of bluegrass without defying the great tradition of American string music. After forming in 2009, the New Old Cavalry has unrelentingly

toured the Midwest, cultivating a deep and diverse repertoire. This multifaceted approach makes the New Old Cavalry a perfect fit for stages large and intimate, and ears new and old.


